Dear congregation,

We might consider dispensing with the greeting time in worship. The greeting time makes many people uncomfortable and actually can drive away first time guests. There is plenty of time before and after worship for greeting friends and guests.
Do not ask guests to stand and/or introduce themselves. Many people (especially younger folks) want to attend anonymously. They want to have a chance to check us out

Hospitality to guests is an important part of having a vital congregation of maturing

welcome, but not overwhelmed. Here are a few things for us to consider:

disciples of Christ. There are things that many churches do that can actually scare guests away; but there are also things that congregations can do that will help make guests feel

younger folks) want to attend anonymously. They want to have a chance to check us out without us embarrassing them by pointing out to everyone that they are new. HOWEVER, if no one talks to them at all, that too, is a put off. Show genuine interest in our guests. Introduce yourself to them.

3. Remember their name. If you greet guests one Sunday and they return another week, it is so helpful if you can then greet them by name.

4. Be prepared to be helpful. If you see a guest looking lost, ask if you can help them with directions, finding a seat, getting a bulletin, or what have you.

5. Invite a guest who is sitting near you to join you at fellowship time. But if you do that, be prepared to sit with them during fellowship time and introduce them to a few people. Don't invite and then ignore. If the guest says "no thanks," accept that and say, "*I understand. I look forward to seeing you again soon!*" And when you DO see them again on a subsequent Sunday, be sure to greet them, and if it feels right, offer the invitation to fellowship time again.

6. Don't smother! Sometimes we nearly suffocate new guests with friendliness. If we sense that someone is uncomfortable, they probably are.

And don't ask a guest to jump right in and do a job in the church. "Oh, so you played drums in your previous church? Well, we need a drummer! You should be our new drummer!" That might work with a few people, but remember guests are still deciding if they want to return at all. If you learn of a particular talent of a guest, you might say, "If you are looking for a place to be involved and use your talents, you would be most welcome to do so here; but you are ALSO welcome whether that is your desire or not. We are just glad you are here."

7. Do not use the term "visitor," instead, use the term "guest." This may not seem like a big deal, but the difference is notable. If we have a "visitor" to our home, that usually means that we were not prepared for them or expecting them. They are seen as outsiders and the feeling can be that we can't get back to "normal" when they leave.

If we receive a "guest" to our home, that means we have prepared for them and we are eagerly anticipating their presence among us. It means we feel honored that they are our guests. \sim Pastor Melanie


Salvation Army Bell Ringing
