

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## From Pastor Melanie

Greetings, friends! I am so excited to share with you a bit about what our newly formed Discipleship Team has been doing!

**Our Discipleship Team**, with a total of 11 people, has been working on ideas for helping our congregation reach out and connect in a meaningful way to those outside our church. We have also been working ideas to aid in the discipleship journey of each of us who are members and attenders of our congregation.

One of the unexpected benefits of being in this group is that we have found it is a way for us to connect with each other, sharing a bit of ourselves with the group each time we meet. We end our time together asking the question early Methodists used to ask as they met in their small groups, "How is it with your soul?" This experience has brought home to us the importance of the small group experience to the development of maturing disciples of Jesus Christ. This is an experience that we hope to help recreate within groups throughout our congregation.

### **Small Group Opportunities:**

Sometime in the next few months I will be offering an 8 - 10 week small group experience using the book, *Foundations: An Introduction to Christian Practices*. Even if you are a long-time Christian, you will likely find this a worthwhile study. Be watching for details!

Also, I will offer another study using a terrific resource called *Discipler: An Interactive Guide to Intentional, Relational, Accountable Discipleship.* This book uses the various aspects of discipleship we've been talking about in church, and breaks them down into devotions and practices. This is one of the best resources of it's kind that I've ever seen! Again, watch for details.

There are two pieces in the works to help us connect with people outside the church in meaningful ways. And we need your help!

- 1. Start "Food and Conversation" with those who come for commodities every other month. The next commodities distribution is on March 21<sup>st</sup> from 11:30 to 12:15. We are looking for someone who will help with serving sandwiches and cookies, fix a pot of coffee, etc. If you would like to do that and/or provide some cookies or sandwiches please contact me. Also, we are looking for a few good conversationalists during that time to sit with folks and just be friendly. Again, let me know! We aren't looking to overwhelm, but just to be friendly and hospitable. We will have some postcards with basic church information to share with folks, as well.
- 2. Begin a DivorceCare group in our church. DivorceCare is a faith based program that helps participants apply biblical principles as they heal from the hurt of separation and divorce. It is an excellent resource. My unofficial research indicates that there is a real need for such a program in our community. We are looking for two lay persons to lead the 10 week program (training and help is provided!), as well as ways to fund it. One generous member has already pledged some money for this, but with another \$150 to \$200 we would have all we need to get started. Please contact me if you are feeling called to be a leader and/or you would like to donate to this worthwhile cause.

Thank you for taking the time to read this! If you'd like to talk about any the above ministries, please stop in and see me or give me a call at the office.

The columns marked W is checked when the book is owned by the local unit. FCL indicates the books that are at the Frank Carlson Library. ILL represents books that may have been ordered via interlibrary Loan from the Frank Carlson Library. Books marked A/V are available for e-readers, videos and audio formats.

To check out a book sign the card and place in the wooden box. After you have read the book please return the card and record in the black book. The UMW can keep track of what are being read when this plan is followed.

Children's books are marked (J) and Youth books are (YA). Have you read to a child or grandchild recently? See what selections are recommended. Some of these books are also available from the school libraries.

Response and New World outlook magazines are also available for checkout.


