Spotlight on Gene & Lynette Saltzman

Hi! Our names are Gene & Lyn Saltzman. We have just recently returned home from a 6-month mission journey to northwest Tennessee working at Reelfoot Rural Ministries. While in Tennessee we spent some time assisting in each of these areas: 1) daycare facility, 2) dentist, 3) eye doctor, 4) attorney counseling, 5) Christmas Toy Store, 6) home repairs, 7) Thrift Store, 8) senior center and 9) food pantry.

RRM was a good fit for us. The talents and skills we possessed and offered paralleled exactly what they needed. They had a huge need for someone with some computer skills as each potential recipient of food needed to prove need to be helped. Lyn accomplished most of this work for RRM in the main office complex. She has many good memories of hearing their life's' journey and being able to help, offer advice and comfort them in any way she could.

Gene spent most of his time helping with trucking duties. He ran a small box truck all over the area making deliveries and pick-ups. He had regular routes that he ran each week to pick up food and used clothing for our food pantry and thrift store. Gene also was interim director of the food pantry for 6 weeks.

We also involved ourselves in a special personal project in the Reelfoot area. We found a needy man that lacked food, heat, water, sewer, electricity and friendship. We met with him almost each Saturday for several hours of visiting. At one point because of the cold, he didn't have anything to eat as all the beans and corn we had given him were frozen in the can. We helped him get some heat in his home as an Arctic blast was approaching.

The time spent in Tennessee really opened our eyes to people in need. Working with the people was as much a benefit to us as it was to them. We still have some farm related duties to wrap up this summer and fall. We are currently making plans for where we may be in mission starting in early 2019. There are a lot of opportunities and it is exciting dreaming where we may serve next!

United Methodist Bishops Recommend a Way Forward

As you may know, our denomination is at a crossroads. In February of 2019, there will be a special session of the General Conference (which includes United Methodist delegates from around the world) to determine how we will proceed concerning the issues of human sexuality. On May 4th the Council of Bishops of the United Methodist Church, who had been engaged in a week long prayerful process to discern a way forward, strongly approved the following motion and rationale:

Having received and considered the extensive work of the Commission on a Way Forward, the Council of Bishops will submit a report to the Special Session of the General Conference in 2019 that includes:

*All three plans (The Traditionalist Plan, The One Church Plan, and the Connectional Conference Plan) for a way forward considered by the Commission and the Council.

*The Council's recommendation of the One Church Plan.

*An historical narrative of the Council's discernment process regarding all three plans.

Rationale: In order to invite the church to go deeper into the journey the Council and Commission have been on, the Council will make all the information considered by the Commission and the Council of Bishops available to the delegates of the General Conference and acknowledges there is support for each of the three plans within the Council. The values of our global church are reflected in all three plans. The majority of the Council recommends the One Church Plan as the best way forward for The United Methodist Church.

Rev. Dr. Maidstone Mulenga, Director of Communications of the Council of Bishops said further, "Guided by the <u>mission, vision and scope document</u>, the bishops agreed to recommend the <u>One Church Plan</u>. This plan provides conferences, churches, and pastors the flexibility to uniquely reach their missional context while retaining the connectional nature of the United Methodist Church...

This plan also encourages a generous unity by giving United Methodists the ability to address different missional contexts in ways that reflect their theological convictions." (for the complete article, see UMC.org)

So, what does this mean for Concordia First United Methodist Church? At the moment, not a lot. If the One Church Plan is approved at the 2019 Special Session of the General Conference, we will be free to continue doing ministry much in the same way we are doing it, with, as the United Methodist slogan goes, "Open Hearts, Open Minds, Open Doors."

The process for the denomination will not be painless. Nothing worth doing ever is. There are those who fear that some individual congregations will be torn apart because members do not see eye-to-eye on the issues surrounding full inclusion of LGBTQ persons. I do not believe this will happen to us. We already know that we are not all in agreement on this issue (nor on a number of others). Still, we press on in unity around our purpose: Coming together to experience Christ's love and working together to live it out. If we keep our purpose before us, we will with God's help, continue to be a relevant, loving presence in our community and beyond.

I will briefly talk in church about this issue on August 5th. In the meantime, please remember in prayer our denomination, the persons affected by our decisions, the congregations, and everyone involved in the process.


