Greetings, Fellow Disciples!

September is here! Wow! It always seems that summer goes by in a flash. In many ways I am ready. I am excited to see how God is going to continue answering our prayers to do "more than we can ask or imagine."

Please check the calendar carefully so you don't miss out on any great opportunities for connecting with God and others through worship, study, service, generosity, and more. I would life up four new exciting opportunities for this fall:

- 1. On Wednesday evenings (at Table Talk) Jean Wilcox will be teaching the study, *Foundations: An Introduction to Christian Practices*. Whether you've been a practicing Christian all your life, or are just beginning your life as a maturing disciple, you will find this study enriching. Books are \$10.



Spotlight on the Nonnie Steinert
