

Boiler Update

Thank you to all of you who have contributed to the fundraiser for the new boiler. As of November 26^{th} , we have received or have pledged $\underline{\$41,074.42}$ which leaves us to raise $\underline{\$8,925.58}$. Demolition of the old boiler started on November 12^{th} , and the boilers were first fired up on November 21^{st} .

There are several tasks yet to be done to complete the installation, but we have heat. As the Trustees, ADCO, and Finance committee discussed the boiler replacement, it was a difficult decision to replace a boiler that was still running even though we knew it had already outlived its expected life span. After the old boiler was demolished, we were told that the center of it was so plugged with rust that they didn't know how we were getting enough water through it to heat the building, and that they did not think it would have made it through the winter.



IMPACT News

Our youth are working hard and making a huge IMPACT in our church and around our community! Fall activities included the annual Hay Rack Ride, the Haunted House, Crunch for a Cause and a concession stand for the Saltzman's Auction. The Haunted House and concession stand were very successful fundraisers.

Why are we raising money? To help pay for our Mission Trip to Green Bay, Wisconsin in June 2019. We have 14 going on the trip.

Sunday, December 2nd is IMPACT Sunday. Our youth will be in charge of the entire Worship Service. They have embraced this task with excitement and exuberance.

The youth are working on the Christmas Program which is December 16th during worship. Join us that Sunday and enjoy the talents of our youth.

During Christmas break we are planning a 30 Hour Famine to Fight World Hunger lock in at our church. More information to come regarding this event at a later date.

Spotlight on Gene Johnson

Gene was born September 6, 1928 on a farm in southern Cloud County, near the 81-24 junction. His parents, Perry and Anna (Forsling) Johnson were both born in Sweden. Perry immigrated with his family when he was 2 years old. Anna immigrated at the age of seventeen by herself on the maiden voyage of the ship, Lusitania. The ship later sank due to a torpedo fired by a German submarine during World War One. Gene's Mom didn't speak English and knew one person, a cousin, who lived in Delphos, Kansas. Anna took a housekeeping job at the Alvie Adams household. Alvie was the owner of the Delphos State Bank. Perry and Anna met and were married the year Anna turned 20.



Gene attended a one room country school for grades 1-8. He then attended Concordia High School, graduating in 1946.

Gene is the 6th of 8 children, 5 boys and 3 girls. Four of the five brothers served in the military during the same time frame. Gene served in the Army from 1951-1953. His time in the Army was mostly served in Germany as a Medic. Gene had turned in his rifle after basic training for a red cross arm patch which was supposed to protect him as he assisted U.S. troops.

Gene and Jean were married on September 6, 1953, which was Gene's 25th birthday. Jean was sure Gene never forget their anniversary by choosing that date. To this union 3 children were born, 2 girls and 1 boy. Their children gave them 4 grandchildren. Jean passed away from cancer in 2008 and daughter Lynnette passed away from cancer in 2018.

His first job, as a young boy, was delivering the daily Blade newspaper. Cloud County Bank was his place of employment for 41 years. Gene retired in 1990 as Senior Vice President. His wife Jean was Secretary to the President of the bank for 15 years. Gene also served as Treasurer of Cloud County Community College for 44 years. He started in 1972 during CCCC's infancy stages (the college was established in 1965).

After many years of attending church and Sunday school at Trinity United Methodist Church (Jean's home church), Gene transferred membership to Concordia First United Methodist in 2006. He found a home at FUMC with many great people.
