

### **Boiler Update**

Thank you to all of you who have contributed to the fundraiser for the new boiler. As of December 19th, we have received or have pledged §46,374.42 which leaves us to raise §3,625.58. Demolition of the old boiler started on November 12<sup>th</sup>, and the boilers were first fired up on November 21<sup>st</sup>. There are several tasks yet to be done to complete the installation, but we have heat. As the Trustees, ADCO, and Finance committee discussed the boiler replacement, it was a difficult decision to replace a boiler that was still running even though we knew it had already outlived its expected life span. After the old boiler was demolished, we were told that the center of it was so plugged with rust that they didn't know how we were getting enough water through it to heat the building, and that they did not think it would have made it through the winter.

### **Christmas Caroling**






### **Cloud County Resource Center Needs**

#### Our Missional Budget 2019 First United Methodist Church, Concordia, KS

Your church leadership has constructed a bold plan of ministry to continue our mission of changing lives for Christ. We celebrate a wonderful past year and commit ourselves to sharing Christ's love and helping people in their own journeys of faith in this new year. We invite you to join us in this journey of being God <sup>1</sup>s people in Concordia through your prayers, your presence, your gifts, your service and your witness!

#### Our Plan of Ministry

#### A. To provide meaningful. life-changing worship every week of the year.

Last year we held 52 regular worship services where an average of 82 persons each week gathered to praise God and hear the scriptures proclaimed. We welcomed numerous guests, heard dozens of anthems and solos, as well as had our worship enhanced by the Praise Band and God's Angels bell ringers. We celebrated Holy Communion 12 times welcoming all to the table. We baptized two persons and renewed our own baptisms in a powerful expression of our faith. We have welcomed new people into our midst. We had some Sundays where our members shared their own powerful stories of God's presence in their lives. And we commissioned two of our members for work as missionaries. Many people have expressed how at home they feel in our worship services. We will celebrate and worship together in 2019 in many ways, both traditional and contemporary. We will share our stories of lives changed, and work to create a space where hearts are warmed and we are given rich spiritual food for the journey.

#### Budget total: \$91,325

(Includes a % of pastor's salary expenses, insurance, etc. Includes a % of administrative assistant salary\* a % of groundskeeper salary; salaries of choir director; organist, nursery coordinator; worship and other applicable supplies, office supplies, music, technological expenses; a percentage of maintenance, building insurance and utilities)

#### B. To nurture persons in their faith journey.

This area includes the traditional forms of Christian education and spiritual formation such as Sunday school classes, small groups, youth and children's programs. It also includes confirmation classes, one-on-one counseling/mentoring/coaching, and support groups. It includes educational opportunities which members and staff may attend. It includes Safe Gatherings certifications for staff and leaders in the church who work with children, youth, and vulnerable persons. It also includes times of fun and fellowship which help build relationships, and the various ways we care for each other.

#### Budget total: \$52,886

(Includes a % of pastor's compensation package, a % of administrative assistant' salary, supplies, maintenance, building insurance, utilities, and education/spiritual formation materials

#### C. To witness to our faith in service beyond ourselves.

We continue to expand our reach in mission. Here in the Concordia area we support or maintain the Little Free Pantry, the distribution of Commodities w/a light meal & fellowship, the putting together of dozens of layette kits, the collection of various items including offerings to support community work with those in need, as well as holding both a springtime "Change the World/Random Acts of Kindness" event, and a fall Mission Day. We also host Red Cross Drives,

Beyond our local area, our money helps provide disaster relief to those affected by tragedy, education to students, training for teachers and pastors, support missionaries, build homes and hospitals, as well as countless other missions. Our money is making a HUGE positive impact.

#### Budget total: \$58,532

(Includes a % of pastor's compensation package, a % of administrative assistant salary, supplies and utilities as needed, money allotted for local mission work, money allotted for mission support in our Great Plains Conference and globally, and stewardship funds.)

#### Grand Total for our Missional Budget: \$202,743

A detailed line item budget is available in the church office for any who wish to receive it.
