From Your Pastor

Greetings! March is here and that means we will start to see signs of spring very soon, I hope. Soon the daffodils will be in full bloom! I know we are all ready for that. FUMC is also gearing up for the Lenten Season.

Ash Wednesday

We will hold our Ash Wednesday service on March 6th at 6:30 pm, in the sanctuary. This service will be a simple beginning to our season of reflection leading up to Easter. All are welcome!

Special Communion Services to Be Offered During Lent

Also, I have decided to offer a brief communion service each Sunday during Lent in the chapel for those who would like a short meditative time before Sunday school. The services will be offered at 9:00 am on the following Sundays: March 10, 17, 24, 31, and April 7, 14, and will last approximately 15-20 minutes. (Note: These will not replace our regular observance of Holy Communion in our worship service on April 7th.) And perhaps one of those Sundays you find yourself needing to head out of town for the day. If so, you can stop into the chapel service and then be on your way! All are welcome!

So, what IS Lent anyway?

Lent is a season of forty days, not counting Sundays, which begins on Ash Wednesday and ends on Holy Saturday (the day before Easter). *Lent* comes from the Anglo-Saxon word *lencten*, which means "spring." The season is a preparation for celebrating Easter. Historically, Lent began as a period of fasting and preparations for baptism by converts and then became a time for penance by all Christians.

Ash Wednesday emphasizes encountering our own mortality and need for God, as well as confessing our sin before God within the community of faith. The use of ashes has been a sign of mortality and repentance that goes back to Old Testament times. The ashes are traditionally from the burned palms from the previous year's Palm Sunday.

May you find this Lenten Season to be one of reflection and renewal!


