Community Baby Shower





Spotlight on Kurt & Cindy Kocher

Kurt and Cindy Kocher were married at the First United Methodist Church in Concordia, Kansas on Dec. 26, 1987. Reverend Blanton officiated the ceremony. Cindy said that they received many sets of folding table and chairs as gifts (probably from members of the Crusader's Class). At this time, Cindy also became a member of the FUMC, transferring her membership from the First Presbyterian Church in Lyons, Kansas. Kurt



was raised in this church. He remembers walking with the congregation from the old church on 7th and Broadway to the "new" church, and the camping trips at nearby lakes with families of the Crusader's Class.

Kurt and Cindy have two sons who were baptized in this church. Kenton, 28, was baptized by Reverend Gottschall, and Tyler, 25, was baptized by Reverend Parker. Both boys were raised in this church and participated in youth activities led by Jean Wilcox. Both boys are graduates of Kansas State University. Kenton now lives in Golden Valley, Minnesota where he works for OSI. Tyler is working on his Master's Degree in Economics at Wichita State. This summer he is interning with Spirit AeroSystems in Wichita, Kansas. Both boys are single and seem destined to be so, even though their mother has reminded them what an awesome grandmother she would be, even taking classes, i.e. Safe Sleeping for Infants.

Kurt farms 12 miles south of Concordia. Kurt started farming in 1978 following a farm accident that paralyzed his father, George Kocher. Helen was instrumental in helping Kurt transition into being responsible for the farm. While farming, he attended CCCC and after 8 years got his associate degree from CCCC. He often times said that he was a slow learner, and that's why he married a Learning Disability Teacher. Kurt grows wheat, soybeans, oats, milo and corn. Kurt has adopted conservation practices on his farm, and in 2007 allowed EDP to build a windfarm on the Kocher's land. Kurt also raises cattle and grows alfalfa. Kurt loves farming and continually tries to stay informed and current with practices and new technology. Kurt soon learned that Cindy cost him more money when she operated machinery, so he discouraged her "help". There are times today though, when she can be seen moving bales with a tractor, working cattle, spraying weeds and fixing fence.

Kurt has been involved in many community committees throughout the years—Optimist Club (how he met his wife), Cloud County Elevator Assoc., Rural Water District, CloudCorp, Farm Bureau, Central National Bank Advisory Board, and the Hospital Board. Kurt is excited about Concordia building a new hospital and has worked hard for many years with many others towards this goal. He has also served on several church committees, i.e. Trustees and Finance.

In 2010, Kurt met his birth mother, Sandy Bieker and her husband, Charles Bieker. Pastor Sandra Moore helped facilitate this meeting at the FUMC, as she had met Sandy prior while pastoring in Clay County. Kurt discovered that he has 2 half-sisters and 1 half-brother, who is taller than him. Sandy's family opened their hearts and arms to Kurt's family, inviting Helen and Kurt's family to their homes during the holidays and for special events. This relationship continues to strengthen and grow.

Kurt is quite the collector. He has a collection of tractors, crawlers, cars and trucks. This hobby has connected him with people throughout the world. Kurt and area steam engine fanatics put on a tractor show called Prairie Plowing Days in 2016. They are planning a national show in August of 2020, along with the Historical Construction Equipment Association. Kurt is excited about this show as it will bring many people to this area and will provide an economic boost to North Central Kansas.

Cindy came to Concordia, Kansas in 1983 following her graduation from FHSU. She was hired through LCNCK as a special education teacher. Cindy taught for 31 years—19 with special education and 12 as a 3rd grade teacher. Cindy retired in 2014. During retirement she has been active with CASA, continues to substitute teach and supports the church through service in the education dept., singing in the choir, and cleaning the church, plus a smattering of other activities. Her "me" times include reading, swimming and traveling. She and Kurt traveled with their children throughout the U.S visiting most of the states while the boys lived at home., but recent travels have taken them to Alaska, the UK, and Europe.

The FUMC and the members of this church now and in the past have been a very important part of Kurt and Cindy's life, and they wish to thank you.
