Mystery Trip History

The first Crusaders Mystery Trip for the Crusaders was in 1997. They were started after a trip (not Mystery) to the Barn in Valley Falls. Kansas. That trip was planned as a dinner out that I thought would be more fun if we went somewhere for the weekend. That trip spurred the concept of an annual trip that I suggested to be a Mystery Trip, with only a few of us knowing the destination. Burnell and Gwydotta Ukens helped Mike and I plan the first trips, most recently they have been planned by me. Since 1997 we have been to approximately 185 different Kansas towns, eaten in 122 different restaurants, stayed at 28 hotels or Bed and Breakfasts, seen 168 interesting sites and attended worship at 20 United Methodist churches, all these activities have been in Kansas. We have driven countless miles across this beautiful state.

A total of 438 people have been on these trips. Several have been on every trip. We have included Lutherans, Presbyterians, Episcopalians, and Baptists.

This year's trip (number 20) included stops in Miltonvale, Mentor, Durham Goessel, Benton, Andover, Augusta, Goddard, Wichita, Towanda and Burrton. We ate at the Kountry Café in Miltonvale, Main Street Café in Durham, Sugar Shane's Café in Augusta, Ginger's Asian Cuisine in Goddard, Mama Nith's Crawfish in Wichita and The Barn in Burrton. We visited Rex's Car Museum in Mentor, Mennonite Heritage and Ag Museum in Goessel, Infinity Art Glass in Benton, Tanganyika Wildlife Park in Goddard, Frank Lloyd Wright Allen House in Wichita, and the Paradise Doll Museum in Towanda. Church on Sunday was at Pleasant Grove UMC south of Burrton.

We invite all to join us on these adventures. They include lots of fun, food and fellowship. ~ Marsha Wentz
