Hayrack Ride History

Carl Swenson, Loren's dad, started the Hayrack Ride when Loren was a child. Mr. Swenson taught Sunday school at the Concordia Baptist church and decided in the 1950's to incorporate a hayrack ride into the October events. Everyone would meet at the Swenson farm, jump on the hay trailer and away they would go to the "Cabin" for a bonfire and wiener roast.



The "Cabin" was built by Carl and Emil (Loren's Uncle) Swenson in the 1930's, when they were just boys. They cut the logs, mixed the concrete and built the cabin all by themselves. The total cost for the project was \$16.34. The "Cabin" was the location for many parties and picnics through the years.

The first few years of the hayrack ride the hay trailer was pulled by two of the Swenson's horses, "Queen and Bird." Mr. Swenson then switched to using his little Ford 8N tractor to pull the trailer. When Loren left for college, his dad stopped hosting the hayrack ride event.

Joyce and Loren Swenson moved back to the farm in 1977 and became Youth Leaders at Concordia First United Methodist Church. They began the annual Hayrack Ride that same year. The entire church family is invited to join in on the fun every October. The farm equipment used in 1977 was a little tractor that pulled a hay trailer. Later Loren started using a pickup to pull a fifth wheel trailer. The trailer is easier to access, has blinkers and brake lights hooked up for safety when traveling on the blacktop.

This year the Hayrack Ride and Weiner Roast is scheduled for Sunday, October 20th. More details to come....watch your bulletin for updates.

Items can be left in the baby carriage in the church entry. Please bring all items by Sunday, October 27th.


