That spring and throughout the rest of the year, we committed ourselves to praying daily for our church. I believe 2021 is a perfect time to resurrect this effort as we move forward in mission and ministry. Won't you commit once again to praying for our church each day?

Set your phones to remind yourself to stop at 7:40 am and/or 7:40 pm each day to pray for our church and the mission and ministry we are called to do.

What is breakthrough prayer? Breakthrough prayer is a petition to God to do new things, beyond our imagining, bigger than we could possibly do on our own – without boundaries, without limits, without anticipated outcome.

"Glory to God, who is able to do far beyond all that we could ask or imagine by his power at work within us." (Ephesians 3:20)

"For I know the plans I have for you, declares the Lord. Plans to prosper you and not to harm you, plans to give you hope and a future." (Jeremiah 29:11)

(Where did we come up with the number 740? It is our street address number here at FUMC. And 7:40 am or pm seemed like a good time to stop and pray. Of course you can choose another time. The important thing is to pray daily for our church.)

Please pray that:

*God would lead us and equip us for the living out of our purpose: To provide a place for all to BELONG to our community; BELIEVE in and experience the transforming love of Jesus Christ, and BECOME His disciples.

*God would help us to break through our limitations, to open our minds to new possibilities, and to embolden our hearts to live out God's vision.

*God would help each of us to be a follower of Jesus Christ committed to being part of the Body of Christ, the Church (living a life of worship & hospitality); becoming more like Jesus (living a life opening to and obeying Jesus); and joining Jesus in ministry (living a life of service and generosity).

Of course, do not forget to pray for others: our family, friends, and neighbors; as well as our community, country, and the world. The scriptures above apply just as much to the needs of our country and world as they do to us personally. Pray for an outpouring of the Holy Spirit on each person living today that we may be transformed in love.

Readiness 360

First United Methodist Church needs YOUR input! Take the Readiness 360 survey. Dear Congregation, Beginning on Feb. 8th you will have an opportunity to help the leadership of our church determine the direction of our church's mission and ministry by completing an online survey. We are beginning a planning process called "Readiness 360" or R-360 for short. R-360 is an online survey tool designed to help congregations identify opportunities for strengthening our multiplication DNA through assessing our 1) spiritual intensity, 2) dynamic relationships, 3) missional alignment, and 4) cultural openness. After a critical mass within our congregation takes the online survey, we will report back our findings and discover next steps together. Watch for an email which will include instructions on how to log in and take the survey. Each member of your household (teenage and up) are invited to take this survey. If you do not have internet access and want to take the R-360 survey, please call the church office and you will be assigned a proxy who will help you with taking the survey. The world around us is changing rapidly and the church needs to do what it takes to make and nurture disciples of Jesus Christ. We are excited to begin this process.


We encourage you to create an account using the e-mail address you receive e-mails on from the church so your giving is associated with your account in the ChurchTrac membership system and will appear on your

Little Free Pantry


