Friends,

My friends in Korea are getting their Covid-19 vaccine. Some have gotten their first, while others have second done. They are telling me that things are worse than ever, with more than a thousand people infected a day. Because of social distancing, businesses are suffering, and people are tired. Their biggest worry is for the kids, as they are back in school. Things were getting better until Delta variant became the dominant virus.

Things are getting worse everywhere. We hear about the numbers in our county and we know it is getting worse here, too. There have been no changes in conference recommendation since our bishop encouraged us to wear masks in church. According to the report from The New York Times, our county had 8 new cases and seven-day average 6. This puts us at "Critical" in the conference guideline (as of August 24).

Our church leaders had a long conversation about the situation. Of course we all agree the safety of our congregation is the most Important thing. Conference guideline recommend "online option only," but we chose to continue with our in-person service, as most of us have been fully vaccinated, with a few stipulations. We want to do everything we can to ensure our safety.

We will not have coffee on Sunday mornings.

We will not congregate at narthex area after the service.

We will social-distance in the sanctuary.

We will encourage each other to wear mask.

We will not shake hands.

We will use hand sanitizers frequently.

Friends, I love being with you. Worshipping with you, I feel, is the best way to worship. I can almost see the Holy Spirit sitting among you, lifting every one of you up. Music is awesome, and seeing you is awesome, too. I do want you to be safe and healthy. Yet, I do want us to get together for worship. Please do what you can to help us continue worshipping together. I trust your judgment in attending the service.





Enhanced Online Giving

We also need volunteers to sew blankets again this year. All of the fabric has been purchased and will be cut to size in advance. **Materials will be ready for pickup in late September.**

There will also be a display of pictures and memorabilia in the meeting room across the hall from the Parlor. It has been interesting to see where our church began and where it is now.




Table Talk to Resume!


