There was another 'first' experience a couple of weeks ago. As you know, I am pretty good with wearing a mask when I am out and about. I was at Walmart, minding my own business. While I was looking for something, a young man said to me, "Oh, you are a liberal. You are truly a liberal." I realized that he was referring to my mask. Little Free Pantry



We will assemble the Layette Sets on Sunday, November 7th. Watch for more details in the November newsletter!


Community Baby Shower



Plans are being made for the Thanksgiving Dinner November 14th. Please keep the date open to help. More information will available closer to the date.




