

FROM YOUR PASTOR

It is October 26 today. I remember the day when I was senior in high school in Korea. On that day, then President Park was assassinated. They are happy to get together to praise the Lord, to care for each other, to nurture future leaders, and to serve their neighbors. They are excited to be the light and salt of the earth.

I understand things are different for us. Pandemic changed everything for us. We were introduced different ways to worship. Getting together for fellowship or bible study has been a challenge. I learned that about 20 percent of church people are not going to come back to church even when we are out of the pandemic. It is so discouraging.

However, I do believe that God is not done with us. The Holy Spirit will continue to work with and through us, just as he has done throughout our history. As we will have overcome the challenges of the pandemic soon, we will thrive as a church again soon. On Sunday mornings, I see signs of us getting back to the church we used to know. I trust that we are not just going back to where we were before the pandemic, but we are moving forward to where God plans us to be. I dream of a thriving church that makes difference for more people in the name of Christ.


