A note from your Pastor:


Happy Mothers' Day! In Korea, the whole month of May is designated as "Family Month." They have "Children's Day" on May 5th, and May 8th is "Parent(s)' Day." There was no Fathers' Day. Instead of giving fathers their day, they changed Mothers' Day to Parent(s)' day.

As we celebrate and honor mothers among us, I reflect on a few things I learned from my mother. She grew up in Methodist tradition and has been a Methodist Christian all her life. She still goes to sunrise prayer service every morning, and attending church services is the center of her life. She reads the Bible every day a few hours a time. She gives more than 10 percent of her income. She spent many hours in church doing service and outreach ministry. She was in Methodist Women, served as president for many years.

I still remember when my mother pulled me out of cub scouts. I was excited to be a cub scout. I liked its uniform and everything. Then, there was an occasion in which I had to miss attending the church on Sunday due to cub scout camping trip. That was it. She said, "On Sunday morning, you are to be at the Father's house."

Anther thing I remember is that my mother always had brand new bills saved for offering. She would go to the bank and ask for new bills. When she could not do it, she would iron bills to make it look nice. I said it would not make any difference whether it is new or not, as the value of money remain the same. Her response was, "I am giving it to God, and God deserves the best from us."

Of course I do not miss church on Sundays, as I am a preacher. I do not iron dollar bills, as I use checks to give. Yet, what she taught me is still ingrained in my heart that God is the one who deserves and demands the best from us.




We encourage you to create an account using the e-mail address you receive e-mails on from the church so your giving is associated with your account in the ChurchTrac membership system and will appear on your annual

T-Shirts are available for a suggested donation of \$5 each.


As part of our partnership with the Cloud County Resource Center, we ask that everyone bring a canned good on May 1st to donate to the CCRC.

Watch for more details on other programs the CCRC will be sponsoring during May to learn more about food insecurity in our community.






