A note from your Pastor,

As I am writing this, Florida is under evacuation order. Hurricane Ian is about to run through the state. It had caused a lot of destruction in Cuba already. There were severe Typhoon in Southeast Asia. There has been so much devastation due to severe weather events all over the world. In the meantime, there are droughts in many parts of the world. I was told that Concordia has not seen a drought like this year's for a long time. There is too much water in one place while there are places where people need water desperately.

Have you ever wondered why God is not moving all the water from where it is flooded to where people need water? Surely, God can do it, right? Then, why not? Even though weather events are viewed as 'evil,' it is one of the causes of human suffering. Whether human activities are making it worse or not is an important existential conversation to have, and more and more people believe we must do more to reduce climate change. Whether you agree with it or not, the creation narrative tells us that God entrusted humans with the care of his creation. Having dominion over God's creation does not mean that we have the power to abuse it. It means that we are given the role of caretaker.

What can we do? Climate change is a global problem, and I am just one person? What difference can I make? I think of the words in "Let there be peace on earth." "Let there be peace on earth and let it begin with me." This is what we sing every Sunday at the end of our worship. Caring for God's creation begins with you. Big or small, there must be something we can do. I cannot explain why humans suffer natural disasters and what God is doing about it. What I can tell you is that when we suffer, God suffers with us. God's presence in our lives is the source of our hope and strength. Also, I can tell you that God wants us to do what we can about human suffering.


