Right now, people are shopping on-line. They call it Cyber Monday. Last Friday was Black Friday, and they say people did about 9 billion dollars' worth of shopping. And they are expecting there will be 11 billion dollars of sales today. They say that it is the busiest shopping season. Some say it is 'revenge buying.' Whatever it is, people are spending more money than ever while we are hit by inflation. I remember a group of Christians. Years ago, in a church I served, they chose not to spend money for themselves during the holidays. 



Our Director, Renata Knox, is looking forward to seeing a full choir loft!











