Revelation 1

Pastor Peddling's:

"You have everything backward! Should the potter be thought of as clay? Should what is made say of its maker, 'He didn't make me'? Should what is shaped say of the one who shaped it, 'He doesn't understand'?" ~ Isaiah 29:16

One of my favorite devotional readings is the one put out daily by the Center for Action and Contemplation out of Albuquerque, NM. For those of you familiar with any of his works, the Center was started by Ftr. Richard Rohr, a Franciscan priest, who has written numerous books. The above passage was part of one he referenced recently in a morning meditation, but I feel it speaks to something I am directly working on right now.

Lately, I have begun conducting interviews with people in the community who work with folks living in poverty as a segway to identifying needs that our United Methodist congregations can address. My focus is not just offering people processes for healing, but it also has to do with my own healing. And I am starting to believe this is a call within my 27-year-old call to ministry.

For years, I often got things wrong. It wasn't because I didn't want to do things the right way; I got things wrong because of my makeup and some of what my own character defects. For the better part of the last 50 years, I protected what I would refer to as my scared child, which developed when I was about 7- or 8-years-old. I recognized that I was protecting that scared child because of the secrets I'd keep, the fears I'd carry, the shame that I let weight me down, and the anger that held me back, all of which protected that scared child from the light of day and the play that is so important for a child to grow.

Discovering that I was protecting this scared child, however, meant I wasn't moving forward and I couldn't heal. Put differently, this has been an overriding feature of my life for so long that I didn't realize what it was doing to me. Recognizing, however, how healing happened for me has provided a new outlook on ministry and it is an outlook I know I must explore and move toward. I remember hearing once that we are what others grow beyond. Eventually the student outgrows the teacher.

Oh. I have ideas about how to proceed beyond the research, but the research I'm doing has blown me away with insights I never could have predicted and when insights come like that, I believe they come because God has a hand in it. That's not to say I won't make mistakes, and it's not to say I haven't made some doozies since I've come to live in Concordia, but it is to say that I feel like God has placed on my heart a singular focus for what our churches can do for the community and, perhaps, what the community can do for our churches.

I wanted to share this with you because one very important, vital part of it necessitates your participation. So, I ask for your prayers because I can't say I've been more dedicated to something than when I was working on my doctorate and I graduated with my doctoral degree in children and poverty in 2014. In time, I will welcome others into this unfolding process and in time, I believe it will give each of us opportunities to grow and serve as we live out our faith.

Until next month ... just keep pedaling – providing it isn't 110 degrees outside in the shade by 10 a.m.

Work has been done to prepare the Fellowship Hall for repainting and other refurbishments! Thanks to all who helped prepare for the work to begin!



















