

# Revelation

### **Pastors Peddling's**

Throughout my career, I have paid attention to styles, methodologies, approaches, tools, and crafts for how preaching can be done. It's been a bit of a fascination for me.

In my early years in the pulpit, something I remember the most vividly are "Holy Spirit" moments where something in worship, perhaps in a song or a prayer, would grab my soul. Occasionally, I would hear God speaking to me in the process of preaching. Those were always interesting moments to say the least.

When my parents were still living, they would send me sermon tapes of the pastor who served their church in southern California at the time. He would often break up his sermons similarly to how I do, and his intercessory prayer often had "teach us what you need us to know and show us what you need us to see," which I'm sure, by now, are words ya'll have heard me use regularly in my sermon prayer. For me, those words don't connect me with that pastor, but they are words that connect me with my parents.

In seminary, I learned about Eugene Lowry's "Homiletical Plot," which is about creating a plot based on the scripture reading; it is a technique I've found strives for the big "aha" moment, similar to what you might find on a TV drama. Another approach I learned actually came from the title "The Four Pages of the Sermon." I forget who authored that book, but the title alone inspired an approach to preaching quite similar to how I preach today where there's an introduction, prayer, contextual content, and how the reading applies in life.

If you think about it, one of the most important aspects of faith is found in story. It may be stories of scripture and it may be stories from our lives. It could even be the story we tell ourselves, sometimes true and sometimes untrue, and it could be the stories we let others tell us about ourselves, which sometimes have merit and sometimes can be incredibly damaging.

For instance, whenever I prepare for a funeral or a memorial service, there are always two questions that I think sum up an individual's life that often find their way into the message for their celebration of life. First, what funny or humorous thing from their life kinda identifies the person they were? The second question is how did the person imitate Christ?

I share all of this with you for a couple reasons. First, to invite you to identify your story or the story that God intends for you. The story God intends for you is not one you necessarily pick for yourself; it's one that has subtleties that point you to the changes you might need to make to live out your conversion or calling in a way that is healing both for you and others, and that honors God.

I'll be the first to say that can be challenging, so that's why it is so important to participate to the best of your abilities in church, ministry, Bible/book studies, mission, holy conversations and so forth. All of those activities facilitate healing in people, and if you learn scripture well enough, you learn that God's love is all about healing God's children and creation. It is often within community where the best and most memorable stories are made.

The second reason is because God is our Divine, Parent and if there are two qualities native to most parents, it is the desire to see their child(ren) grow, and usually for their child to know they're loved. Love is not expressed in letting a child do whatever they want to do/want, and it is not expressed in excessive discipline. Guiding growth requires consistency, compassion, learning, and grace. In other words, God wants us all to grow in faith. I know as I grow in faith, I am starting to see with greater clarity how God wants my life to be. The same may be true for you, I don't know. While I have given sermon series before, the current one on "Going Another Way" and the one I am toying with for Lent are intriguing something in me, and I hope you hear God speaking to you through the "Way" series as well.

So, what stories do you have? I've heard a few in my time with you (something to do with a one-armed mannequin comes to mind). I look forward to hearing more.

participants must sign-in at the front door and bring their most recent tax return; coats will be available only to those who did not participate in the November distribution event and are only available to people living in the recipient's household. The CCRC will hold a Soup Supper on Thursday, February 15<sup>th</sup>, from 5:00 – 7:00 pm. Chili (with cornbread and cinnamon rolls) and Chicken Noodle Soup (with mashed potatoes) will be served for \$5.00/bowl. All proceeds will go to launching a homeless food pantry that will operate separately from the food bank.

February 18th is our next Whole Church event. We will be playing Bible Pictionary during the Adult Bible Story hour. No experience necessary!


