Pastor's Peddling's,

Since about 2007, I have written what's called Morning Pages. In the early days, Morning Pages was a tool I used to emotionally barf initially on the written page and later on the electronic page. Emotional barfing was helpful for me when I was wrestling with things, I would find myself challenged to understand.

Since then, my morning writings have expanded to include a written reflection that responds to a reflection I read on the Kindle app on my phone, and most days a written daily prayer.

In recent years, morning page writing has taken a new direction. Instead of writing to emotionally barf on the electronic page, I now write to apply things I've learned about human behaviors as they relate with my personal behaviors because often, I will interact with people based upon what I learned emotionally in my family growing up.

A family system is like a roadmap of how families interact emotionally for about four or five generations. On occasion, I will share my family tree with others to show where I have identified emotional connections and disconnections, cutoffs, patterns, triangles, enmeshments, fusions, and even family secrets with others as a teaching tool. Family systems was discovered by social scientist Murray Bowen in the 1950s, who found that our family of origin is the single-most influential force in our lives. My studies of family systems stem from Edwin Friedman's research in the 1980s and 1990s; Friedman was a student of Bowen's.

Through the years, families exhibit traits that get passed on from generation to generation, unless younger family members identify patterns and then intervene to stop history from repeating itself. Family systems are applicable regardless of what background or ethnicity the family represents. Family system work is also represented in Emotionally Healthy Spirituality classes like the two that have been offered in First Church since last September.

So, getting back to my family system and to my morning page writings. After practicing morning pages and family systems for 17 years now, I've noticed something recently that has pleasantly surprised me. Where I once used them as part of my faith that always seeks understanding, lately I have felt like the writings are starting to keep me.

It's been a dramatic shift and after all that has happened within my family in the last four months, the last 20 months in particular, and after all that has happened in my life in the last five years, I'm glad my morning pages are starting to keep me. For me, it almost feels like a resurrection within the resurrection or an Easter within Easter that makes me willing to wait in the darkness for the risen Christ to appear. God works best in the darkness, I think, so this has been like a light dawning on the horizon of my soul.

I don't share this story as anything that represents some personal privilege or because my ego needed to get it out there. I share it from a place of vulnerability because from vulnerability comes courage, and I like to think courage is one of the primary roots of hope. Besides, who knows if there may be one person out there who reads this who holds onto hope because of this true-to-life story, of sorts.

So, I share what I've shared this month with a question: What story do you have to share? Please feel free to let me know because I'd like to hear it and you never know who else needs to hear it. Just as we are blessed to have this newsletter at our disposal to share stories like this, we have other ways to share, such as our Facebook platform and the devotional videos I post each week.

If there is one thing I believe, it's that every one of us makes a difference but the biggest difference happens when we share our story with others because you never know who might need to see it, read it, hear it or see it. Safety Update

The FUMC Safety Team is working to ensure everyone is safe when in the church building. Please review policies below on Fire and Tornado Emergencies.

FIRE


Call 911 and provide the location of the fire, your name, and phone number you are calling from.

Notify others in the building of the fire emergency.
All occupants must evacuate the building using designated evacuation routes.

Evacuation routes have been posted in each room that mark the emergency exits and evacuation routes. All should congregate in the upper parking lot (near the Little Free Pantry) and remain outside until notification from church leadership or the fire department that it is safe to re-enter the building.

When emergency personnel arrive, notify them of anyone you know, or suspect is still in the building.

Fight the fire only after calling 911, if the fire is small and not spreading to other areas, and escaping the area is possible by backing up to the nearest exit, and the fire extinguisher is available for use



TORNADO

When the warning is issued by siren or other means, seek inside shelter. <u>The designated shelter is in the lower cross-hallway underneath the sanctuary.</u> <u>Signage in the lower-level hallway marks this shelter area.</u>

Stay away from all outside walls and windows. Use arms to protect your head and neck.

Remain sheltered until given the "all-clear" by church leadership or group leader.






