
Pastor Pedalings,


Next to my parents (who both passed away in 2006), Sally was one of the most influential people in my life. She was 14 years older than me, but she was also a second mother to me, and she was the first mentor I

ever had.

Sally graduated from the University of Nebraska-Lincoln with a degree in food science and she was a marvelous cook when she cooked.

As I have thought about Sally's life since receiving the news of her death yesterday, she lived her life to make the lives of those around her better. I don't know if that was her driving force; we never had that conversation. But I saw her express that in the principles that guided her life and I saw her do that in her relationship with Dave and I watched her do it with their children, Dan, Ami, Tim, and Crissy's lives, and in the lives of their spouses and the grandchildren she was blessed to have. She had me live with her family when I went to school in Denver, so I was practically one of her kids. I think she wanted me to experience the dynamics of family relationships, since my childhood was unique from my siblings. I can't say I realized that until after my own children were grown; I think it would have made me a better parent.

Sally touched a lot of lives. It was her imitation of Christ, and it is my hope and prayer to learn from that even in her passing, so I am more inclined to just listen non-anxiously and patiently to people when they are hurting like she listened to me so many times. She was a non-anxious presence in my life especially at times when my life was chalk-full of anxiety. Going through a second divorce, I remember watching Sally and Dave and how they interacted after 50 years of marriage and I'd often think to myself how they were modeling love in such a way that I felt loved to be part of

their conversations.

I will miss my sister every day for the rest of my life. I will miss the way she'd joke when I'd post something silly on Facebook. I will miss how she would share with me tidbits about my family when I didn't have a clue. I will miss her instruction when I would come to her for insights that I needed in my life. I will miss her laugh, her smile, her hugs, and her presence. I only hope that I may offer the best version of me so others may see how her reflection – her imitation of Christ – lives on.

And just for the record, sis, 1434 (I (1) Love (4) You (3) More! (4))


even though I'm pretty sure you loved me more all along. Until next month, just keep pedaling.



**Easter Egg Hunt and Activities will take place on Easter Sunday morning starting at 9:30. Bring your children and grandchildren for a morning of fun!


**We would like monetary donations to purchase candy. Any extra \$ will go to Christian Education activities. Thank you for your support!
